There is no question that we are in an unprecedented situation and we are all struggling to adapt to our new reality. Working together with grit and compassion we can meet the challenge of this moment, provide continuity for our children, support the herculean efforts of our teachers, administrators and staff, and plan for a future when we are free to resume our normal lives.

We on the Board are filled with enormous gratitude for the work of our educators. Our team has reinvented educational delivery for our children essentially overnight. While our distance learning plan continues to be improved, we must acknowledge the enormity of this undertaking. And we appreciate the added burden on parents who are now taking on a greater role in their children's education. We are enormously pleased to tell you that on April 2 we are also planning to vote on the appointment of our new permanent superintendent. We can all be heartened by this opportunity to look to the future and contemplate the growth and dynamism our new educational leader will bring to the district. We look forward to celebrating in person as soon as we can.

Please be well and continue to social distance and diligently follow the instructions of our local leadership. Let us continue working together to stay safe, to educate our children, and to support one another through this challenging situation.
